

MINUTES of the meeting of Potterspury Parish Council held on Wednesday 10 November 2021 at 7:30pm in Potterspury Village Hall.

6053	PUBLIC FORUM: Mr Coppin, NHW Coordinator and Police Liaison Rep provided an email report: Crime figures: September 2021 – SN 236 (Potterspury 4) Police Beat Bus visited village today. Warnings regarding drink spiking. Email and Text scams still a problem.				
6054	REPORT FROM WNC COUNCILLOR: Cllr William Barter Cllr Barter encouraged all PCs and residents in the area to respond to the WNC Strategic Plan Spatial Options Consultation especially with regard to the proposed 6,000 houses in Old Stratford and 4,000 in Towcester. Closing date 06/12/21. WNC has submitted a bus service improvement plan with funding from Central Government in order to restore some of the services from before the NCC cuts. Community Grants starting again for volunteer groups, not Parish Councils. All WNC Councillors each have a £2,500 discretionary grant budget. The new £42 charge for emptying green bins is to harmonise charges throughout the County.				
6055 (i) (a)	PLANNING: Planning Applications: WNS/2021/1652/FUL Parking area and dropped kerb on land in front of 28 Church End. It was resolved to submit a response to WNC Planning of objection on the following grounds: It will result in the loss of valuable on-street parking and no consultation with neighbours.				
(b)	 WNS/2021/1661/PIP Application for permission in principle for development of 5-7 custom/self-build dwellings. Land east of allotments Poundfield Road. It was resolved to submit a response to WNC Planning of objection on the following grounds: The land is outside the village framework and is in open countryside. The maps in the proposal show 7 plots with an access road and a layout that clearly allows for further development. This would appear to facilitate piece-meal and unstructured developments towards the south. It is unclear how local need for affordable housing could be improved by this proposed type of development (self-build). 				

- 4. This land formed part of an application that was dismissed on appeal in February 2015 (APP/Z2830/A/14/2224285). In his decision letter the inspector noted that this area is a gateway to the village and that developments here could "erode the rural setting of the village". We consider that this development would be another step in that direction.
- 5. Poundfield Road is a rat-run between the A508 and A5 for those seeking to avoid congestion at the Old Stratford roundabout. Any access to this site would require vision splays, particularly given the location of the proposed private allotments.
- 6. If permission in principle is given to this proposal, then any dwelling on the site would need to match the style adopted at nearby Mansion Gardens.
- 7. Neighbours have not been consulted.
- (c) WNS/2021/1666/FUL Parking area and access road to facilitate use of land as private allotments. Poundfield Equestrian, Poundfield Road.

It was resolved to submit a response to WNC Planning of objection on the following grounds:

- 1. We consider that the road shown is not required to facilitate the size and location of the allotments.
- 2. This road appears to only serve potential housing development which is subject to another application WNS/2021/1661/PIP.
- 3. This proposal would make an unnecessary road access.
- 4. Neighbours not consulted.
- (d) WNS/2021/1732/FUL Variation of condition 2 to S/2020/0868/FUL (Removal of modern casement windows to front and rear rood elevations, removal of plastic rainwater goods. Replacement with timber casements and painted metal rainwater goods.) To allow alterations to window details. Grafton House, 11 Church End. It was resolved to submit a response of no objection to WNC Planning.
- (e) WNS/2021/1733/LBC (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) as above. Grafton House, 11 Church End.

 It was resolved to submit a response of no objection to WNC Planning.

- (c) WNS/2021/1628/SCR Land at the former Furtho Pit, Old Stratford/Cosgrove: Screening opinion for 9 no. logistic units comprising 70,743 sq m / 761,471 sq ft (GIA) of floor space within Class B2 or B8 uses of the Town and Country Planning Use Classes Order 1987, with ancillary E(g)(i) offices and Class E(g)(ii) for research and development of products and processes, together with a Country Park, ground reprofiling in the Country Park, new vehicular access from the A508 and associated site infrastructure including lorry parking.
